Get ready for Spring MAP testing! The second round of MAP testing for this school year will take place from Monday, May 13th - Thursday, May 30th. It is a computer-based adaptive test that becomes easier or harder, depending on the success of the student taking it. We give students the MAP to determine each child's instructional level and to measure academic growth throughout the school year, and from year to year in the areas of Language, Reading, and Math. Check with your child's classroom teacher or advisor for his/her testing schedule. Following the testing period, you will receive a report showing and explaining your child's performance.
